Spring Has Arrived in Garden Villas

This winter was a tough one for Houston and Garden Villas in terms of weather. An early freeze late in 2017 gave our outdoor tropical plants a good strike, and then a multi-night freeze in early 2018 seemingly sealed the deal for any remaining tropicals along with many other younger or weaker plants in the ground. My wife and I had a late crop of butternut squash in our raised bed garden that we hoped to enjoy, but Mother Nature had other plans!

Judging by the piles when the City finally resumed tree waste pickup, we have all been out with our machetes and loppers cleaning up the mess. However, now spring is here and it is such a relief to see green leaves appearing again. It seems every tree species except our lazy pecans have at least started to leaf out (crossing fingers and knocking on wood that this will be a good pecan crop year). Many of us are sneezing and sniffing our way through the pollen extravaganza, skimming our swimming pools daily and cleaning the filters, and even watering lawns a bit since we have had a few weeks without much appreciable rainfall.

As I'm writing this article, our red amaryllis (pictured right) are blooming in multiple locations as they do each March, and I take time to appreciate the previous owners of our home for taking the time to plant these and so many other perennials at some point in history. Roses are flowering now too, and next will be the Crinums and other lilies.

Last year we had a couple volunteer native sunflowers pop up in our front yard in an existing bed and opted to let them do their thing—they were a nice, rustic touch to all the intentionally planted species out there. This year, there many more sunflower plants that have popped up, ostensibly from last year's seeds, and for the most part we're taking a laissez faire approach. I had never taken the time to read about the benefits and uses for our native sunflowers, and I encourage you to

do so. They're good for wildlife, and parts of the plant were used for centuries in Native American remedies. Information is available on several sites, including that of the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center (they are in Austin and worth the visit if you haven't been) at www.wildflower.org.

I encourage everyone to make some time to be outdoors, enjoy your yard, meet your neighbors, and have a great spring!

A&P Mechanic Derrick Ford Saves Elderly From Fire

An explosion preceded a large fire that swept through the home of the Landry family in the southeast Houston neighborhood of Overbrook on Hirondele Circle on Thursday afternoon.

The fast-moving fire destroyed the home and two late model BMWs in the driveway. Before the fire and heavy smoke took any lives, neighbor Derrick Ford jumped into action.

"I was inquiring about a job on the phone. Afterwards, I heard the explosion. It was much louder than a blown fuse. We initially thought it (the explosion) came from Hobby Airport which is not far from us. But after the second explosion, I saw the smoke and we knew it was in the neighborhood," Ford said.

Lora Landry was struggling to pull a black sleeping bag while leaving the burning home. Neighbors watched in shock and horror as the fire spread. Ford raced to Landry's aid while white smoke rushed from the structure. He discovered inside the black sleeping bag rested the frail and

elder mother of Landry. Ford carefully lifted and carried the elderly mother to safety.

Some neighbors began moving their cars parked in the circle while others ran to take cover not knowing what to expect. Others began praying to console each other.

"It is sad we could not save the two dogs. It was surreal," said Ford.

Meanwhile, the Houston Fire Department came to extinguish the ravaging blaze. In a short time the fire was under HFD's control.

Meanwhile, neighbors claimed hearing over six explosions. The cause of the fire is under investigation.



Garden Villas Park Project Goals

The park project will enhance Garden Villas park and promote area redevelopment. Funding for the project would come from applying for private and public grants instead of waiting for capital funding.

A multi-disciplinary team including local professional resources for design and construction plans will be used. GVCA has conducted several community input meetings and will continue to keep the public involved.

The project will lead to a better understanding of the urban environment and natural drainage systems. It will be an example of a green storm water infrastructure installation.

Economic, educational, and health benefits for Garden Villas and Southeast Houston will come from the project.

Park use will be increased by creating a safe environment for exercise and walking. There will be a system of accessible pathways connecting the park's assets and connecting to the Sims Bayou Greenway.

By using local qualified professionals, GVCA will conduct constructability reviews at key schedule mile stones so that there are no surprise cost overruns or compromised construction standards.
